To unveil the final answer, first listen to the clues on www.anglais-pour-voler.com and place the missing words (as usual, one dash is one word) on the grid. Words can be found horizontally, vertically and diagonally. Then spot all the unused letters in the grid (left to right, top to bottom) and write them down to spell out the definition of an aircraft part. Which part is it?

Clues
